Municipalities are encouraged to speedily pay the Department of Water

and Sanitation

Some Eastern Cape municipalities owe the Department of Water and Sanitation (DWS) a

huge amount estimated at R18 million for water services. The DWS implores municipalities to

pay the outstanding arrears and review their tariffs to ensure that water and sanitation

services are paid.

The DWS is encouraging communities to pay water rates, report water leakages and spillages

in their areas. By paying services this will assist in the improvement of service delivery and to

the maintenance of infrastructure.

According to the Minister of Water and Sanitation, Ms Nomvula Mokonyane, the War on

Leaks programme is the department's flagship programme aimed at reducing water losses

through repairs, retrofitting and replacements. The country loses seven billion rand (R7 billion)

a year through unaccounted for water.

The DWS also advises municipalities to implement the War On Leaks (WOL) programme in

order to deal with the water leakages in their jurisdictions and also to review their water

operations. The WOL project will proactively minimize water losses in the country which are

estimated to cost around R7 billion per annum.

The Department of Water and Sanitation encourages the Eastern Cape communities to

continue saving water and use it wisely.
