Northern Cape Water Users to Discuss Raw Water Tariff Hike

26 June 2019

The Department of Water and Sanitation is in the process of holding raw water tariff consultations with various water users in the country. The Lower Orange Catchment session is scheduled for the 17 July 2019 in Upington.

To supply water to all people at an acceptable level of assurance, quality and access costs money both in terms of capital investment into infrastructure and the operation and maintenance costs associated with water treatment, bulk water distribution and reticulation within human settlements.

Suitable tariffs must be set by all relevant water services institutions involved in the water services cycle. Paying for water is a key principle and a mechanism to ensure that the water is used effectively and sparingly. The criteria for the setting of tariffs and the procedures are prescribed in various legislation and regulations, notably the Water Act, the Pricing Strategy for Raw Water Use Charges and the Water Services Tariff Regulations.

As much as water is a basic right and all people must have access to at least the basic level of service, water users have a responsibility to use water responsibly.

Water contributes to socio-economic development in South Africa. It needs to be protected, conserved and used in a sustainable manner.
